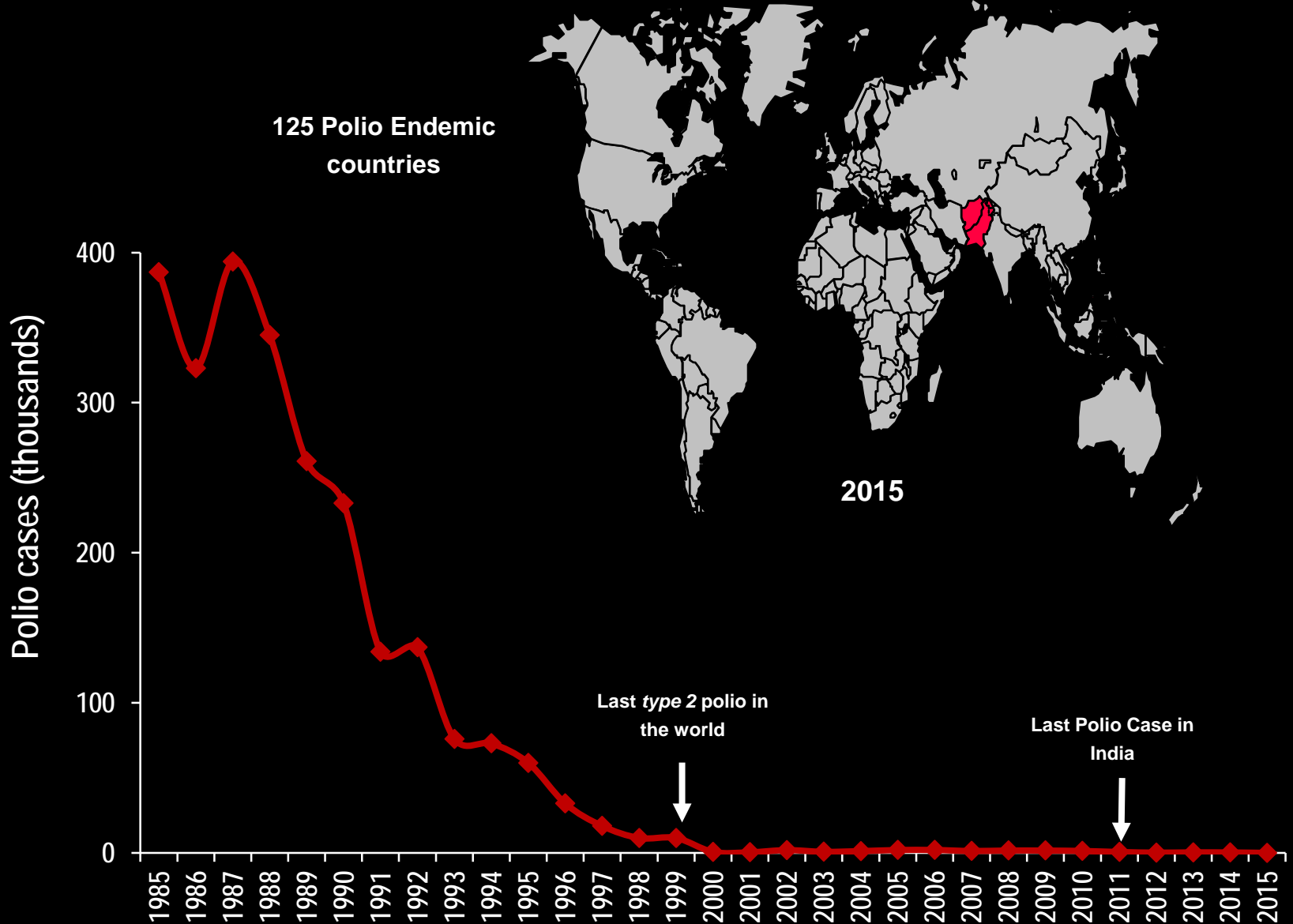

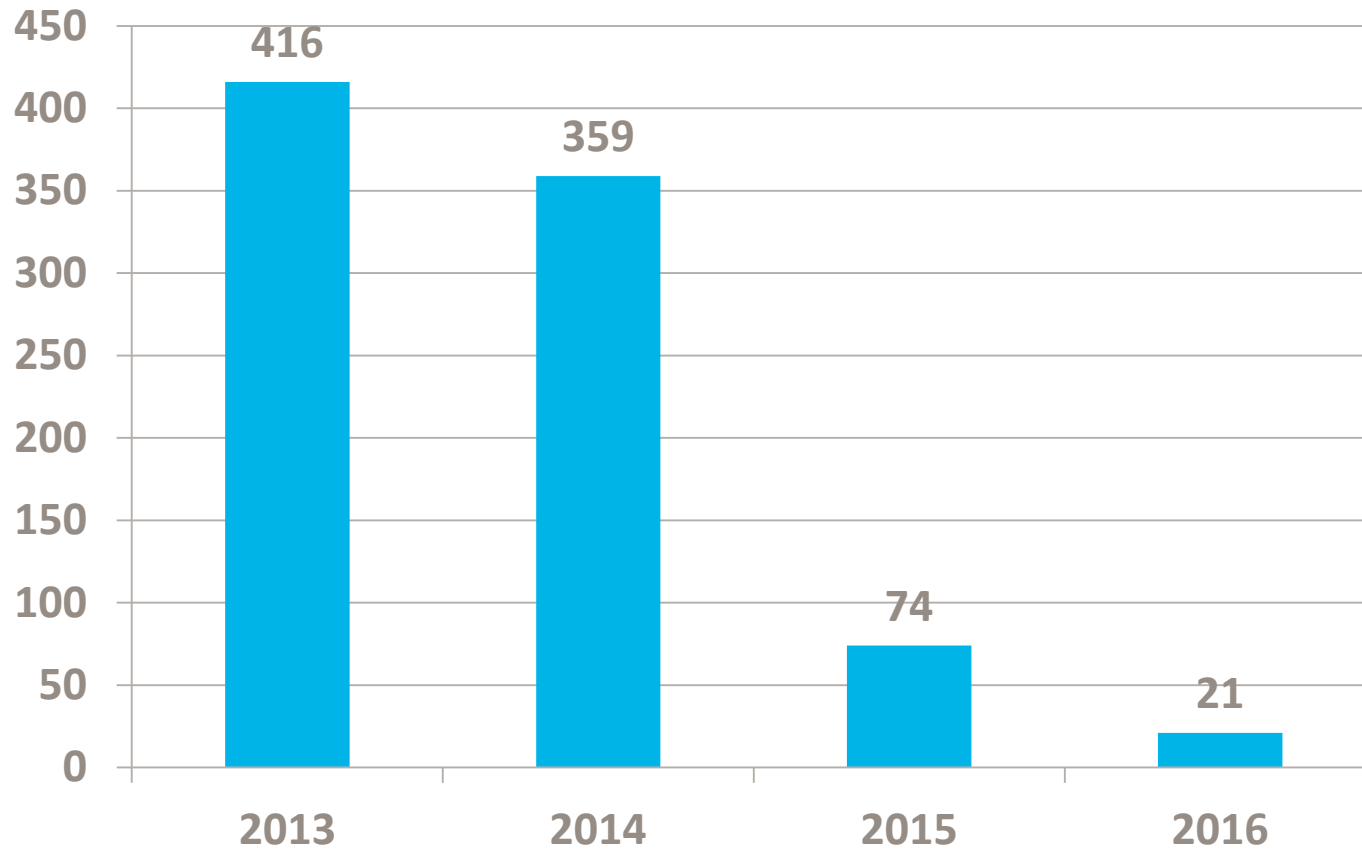

# Wild Poliovirus (as of 15 August 2016)



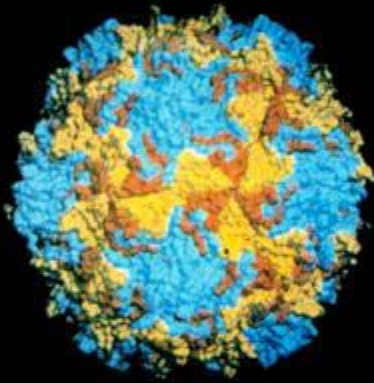
Until June 2016, only Afghanistan and Pakistan had reported a total of 19 cases of wild poliovirus



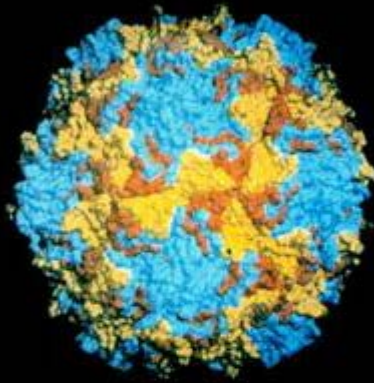
In July 2016, Nigeria detected two cases of wild poliovirus

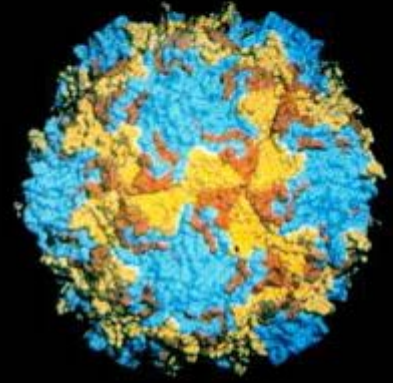

# The Broader Benefits of Polio Eradication

The polio eradication program is strengthening routine immunization around the world, particularly in conflict zones and fragile states. For example:



In Bihar, **India**, polio efforts helped boost routine immunization coverage from 31% in 2004 to over 80% in 2013.



In **Somalia**, GPEI funds have helped revamp the cold chain system that supports polio and measles immunization.

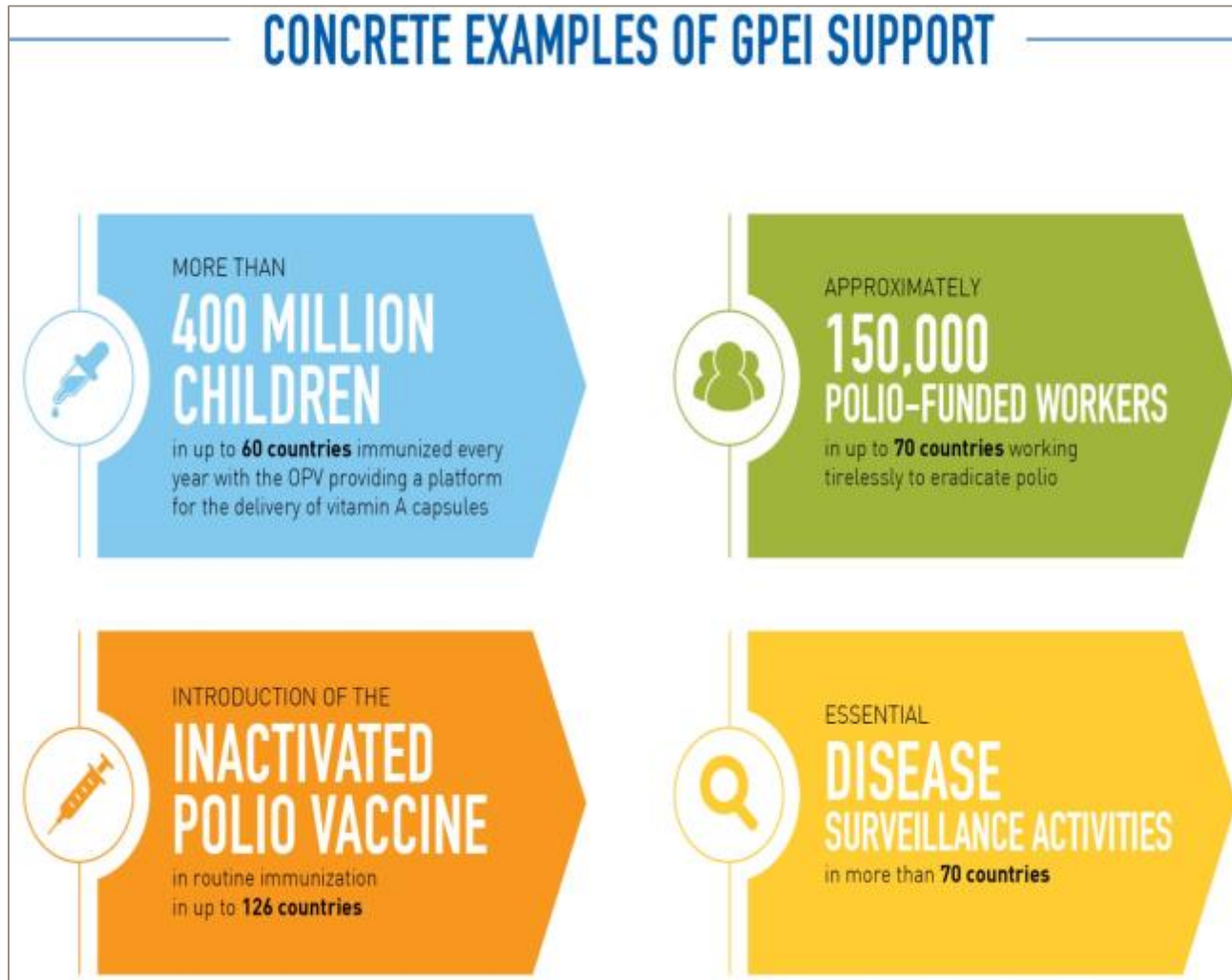
# Fragile Progress

# Planning for a Polio-free World

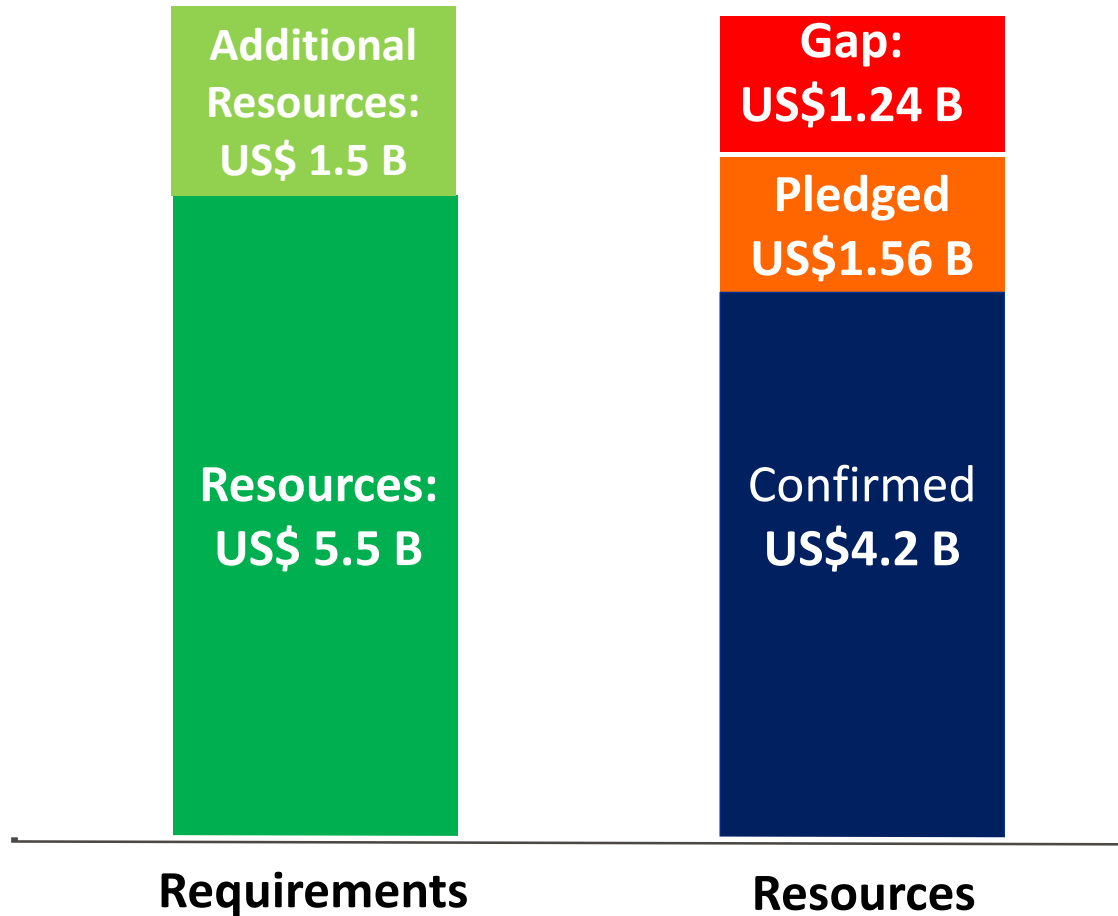
- Maintaining and mainstreaming essential polio functions (e.g., immunization, surveillance)

(New funding announced in October 2015)

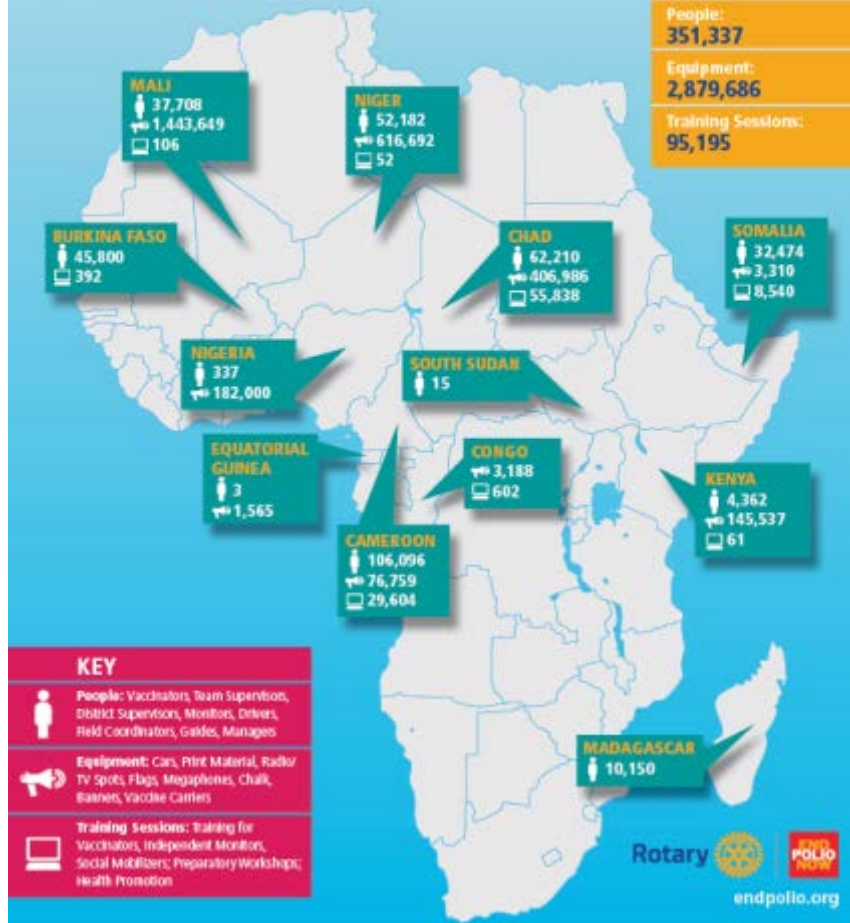
